Hi Friends –

Have you heard? It's outrageous! For this year NARAS, the organization that gives the annual Grammy Awards, **has cut 31 categories**. Among the genres most affected are Latin Jazz, R&B, Zydeco/Cajun, Mexican, Native American, Gospel, and World Music. Do you see a pattern here? You should, because there certainly is a pattern – **a racist one**.

Percussionist, educator, and multiple Grammy nominee **Bobby Sanabria**, who is spearheading a drive to overturn this insult, this travesty, got it exactly right: "The Grammy Awards celebrate America's musical landscape in all of its diversity. The Academy was founded to engage, empower, educate, nurture and cultivate all forms of music. The current administration, under President Neil Portnow, has failed to administer the mission of NARAS. This is best exemplified by the **lack of cultural diversity on the telecast over the last ten years and the current ill advised category cuts of which 70% represent indigenous forms of music by people of color.**"

What can be done? Go to grammywatch.org for updates, see what artists like Carlos Santana are saying, support [possible protest actions](#). And [sign the petition](#) to reinstate the categories and demand respect for these living musics.

Frank Sinatra said it perfectly at the first Grammy Awards ceremony in 1959: "**Remember, it's about excellence, not popularity.**" Maybe it was once. Maybe it can be again. So to this year's Grammy nominees I'd just like to say: 1. Congratulations, and 2. I wish there were more of you.

NEW & RECOMMENDED CDS

Jay Ashby & Steve Davis: Mistaken Identity (himpsl): Trombone "twins" Jay Ashby and Steve Davis — they do bear a resemblance, hence the CD's title — pair up in the venerable J&K tradition for an appealing set of originals and standards. Highlights include Jobim's "Chega de Saudade," Benny Golson's "Stablemates," Neal Hefti's "The Old Couple" theme, and the lovely, but seldom heard, ballad, "Nina Never Knew."

Don Braden & Karl Latham: Big Fun(k) Live (Creative Perspective Music): Funk ain't funky if it also ain't fun. That's the promise of tenor saxophonist Don Braden and drummer Karl Latham's Big Fun(k) project. And that promise is fulfilled on this live CD — situated at the intersection of funk and jazz — that also features bassist Gary Foote and the accomplished and versatile keyboardist Nick Rolfe.

Tomoko Ohno & Ricardo Lew: From Tokio to Buenos Aires (Midway Point Music): Japanese pianist Tomoko Ohno traveled — musically and physically — to the homeland of the brilliant Argentine acoustic guitarist Ricardo Lew to collaborate with him on this tango-infused duo recording. A gifted pianist, Ohno also is a formidable composer, boldly bookending nine of her original pieces between works by J.S. Bach and Astor Piazzolla.

Dennis Rollins Velocity Trio: The 11th Gate (Motéma): A trombone-led organ trio? Why not! Dennis Rollins does it on this new release, and he does it superbly. Rollins' take on Eddie Harris' "Freedom Jazz Dance" is refreshing and his use of electronics is inventive and appealing. But most of all it's the inherent humanity and humanism of his original compositions that bursts through on every track.

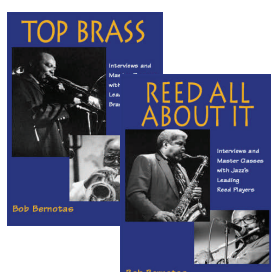
