Hi Friends —

As you probably heard by now, tenor saxophonist-composer-arranger **Frank Foster** died on July 26 at the age of 82. When I interviewed Frank for a 1992 profile he told me this story about his most famous composition:

I wrote "Shiny Stockings" in 1955 and we had a rehearsal at a place called Pep's Bar in Philadelphia. We had just arrived in town. Everybody was sleepy, tired, hungry, and evil. Nobody felt like rehearsing. We rehearsed "Shiny Stockings" and it sounded like a bunch of jumbled notes, just noise, and I said, "Wow, all the work I put into this, and it sounds so horrible. I know Basie will never play it." And then something very strange happened. He continued to play it and it came together. Finally, we recorded it and, well, it's the very best known piece that I have contributed to the Basie book.

It embodies all the things that were important to him. It builds — it starts soft and ends with an explosion. It leaves space for the rhythm section to do whatever it's going to do. It has that ensemble writing which the band can sink their teeth into and really make happen — and a wonderful trumpet solo by Thad Jones.

Years later Basie gave me the supreme compliment. Every now and then he'd say about a chart, "Oh, it's very nice, kid," and then leave it at that. Well, he grabbed me, he said, "Junior, you know that 'Shiny Stockings?' You really put one down that time." You couldn't receive a better compliment from Count Basie.

NEW & RECOMMENDED CDS

Frank Giasullo: Kensal Road (Vanderveer Records): There is a great deal to recommend about this new CD by Pennsylvania-based pianist Frank Giasullo's quartet. An inspired and insightful soloist, Giasullo also has penned six fine originals, tenor and soprano saxophonist Art Themen alternately sings and roars, particularly on a spirited "House of the Rising Sun," while bassist Nicholas Krolak and drummer Pat Tamminen provide solid and sensitive teamwork.

Monika Herzig: Come with Me (Owl Studios): There is not an unpleasant or unreal moment on this latest release from pianist-composer Monika Herzig. Performed by different ensembles and instrumentations, Herzig's original tunes each tell a story, and her interpretations of Cole Porter, Hoagy Carmichael, and — yes — Bob Dylan and Paul Simon are refreshing and personal. As a bonus, this package includes a DVD documentary about Herzig's life, her art, and this project.

Jeff Lederer: Sunwatcher (Jazzheads): Saxophonist-clarinetist Jeff Lederer's huge, searing timbre and soaring improvisations (and the clever cover photo) invoke the powerful art and soul of Albert Ayler. Lederer, bassist Buster Williams, drummer Matt Wilson, and Jamie Salt on keyboards have crafted a bold, spirit-driven program that, in addition to honoring the late, visionary saxophonist, also includes original homages to Arnold Schoenberg and Artie Shaw.

Harvie S: Too Late Now (Ward Records): Having sat "in the can" since 1988, this collection of popular standards and jazz compositions really should have been titled "Better Late Than Never." Bassist Harvie S heads a trio with Bill Charlap — one of the finest pianists on today's scene and already an accomplished player back then at the age of 22 — and drummer Todd Strait. It may have been 23 years in coming, but this music definitely was worth waiting for.

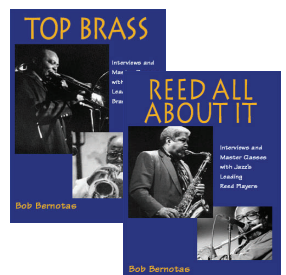
