Hi Friends –

Anyone who knows me, knows that there is no one in the jazz world whom I hold in higher regard than saxophonist-composer-arranger **Frank Foster**. Well, last month, after fifty-five years, Frank finally reclaimed all the publishing rights to his best known composition, "[Shiny Stockings](#)."

Frank composed and arranged the song for the Count Basie band, of which he was an integral member for eleven years, back in 1955, but he naively signed away most of the publishing rights. And so, every time "Shiny Stockings" was recorded, someone else collected the bulk of the royalties for what quickly became a jazz standard.

But with the help of the Community Law Clinic of Rutgers University Law School, Frank managed to navigate that swamp called "U.S. copyright law," and at long last may republish "the one that got away," as he calls his signature tune, under his own name – and receive *all* of the future royalties. And what's more, filmmaker Brain Grady of [Jazz Legacy Films](#) now has a happy ending for his forthcoming documentary on Frank Foster.

[Jon Blondell](#): **Alive! at the Elephant Room** ([Fable Records](#)): Trombonist Jon Blondell, a long-time fixture on the Austin, Texas, jazz scene, displays his superb chops and witty improviser's imagination in this vibrant quintet set, recorded in his city's top jazz venue. Blondell is living proof — take note, fellow NYC chauvinists — that there is plenty of fine jazz to be found west of the Hudson River, if you just take the time look for it.

[Allison Miller](#): **Boom Tic Boom** ([Foxhaven Records](#)): Drummer Allison Miller's second release as a leader is as much about the colors and textures of her chosen instrument as it is about rhythm and pulse. Pianist Myra Melford and bassist Todd Sickafoose make their own valuable additions to Miller's rich palette of primary and pastel hues, as does her special guest on selected tracks, violinist Jenny Scheinman.

[Harvie S](#): **Cocolamus Bridge** ([Blue Bamboo Music](#)): On his new release, bassist Harvie S exhibits his versatility as a player and a composer. Harvie's fluid technique and rich tone are well displayed on the Irish folk song "Eili Gheal Chiuin" (by a multitracked bass "choir") and Wayne Shorter's "Night Dreamer" (an intuitive duet with soprano saxophonist Woody Witt), as well as on six diverse, original works, performed with a fine group of Houston-based players.

[Roland Vazquez Band](#): **The Visitor** ([RVCD](#)): Percussionist Roland Vazquez steps away from the drums and takes his place in front of a nineteen-piece ensemble to conduct six original compositions, plus his mentor Clare Fischer's classic composition and arrangement, "Guarabé." Vazquez' writing is deep and dense, inspiring an array of outstanding soloists, who further enliven these evocative and frequently astounding works.


