NEW & RECOMMENDED CDS

Jamie Baum: [In This Life \(Sunnyside\)](#): Flutist-composer Jamie Baum has taken her already formidable art to the next level with this striking new septet release. Inspired by the music of South Asia, particularly Pakistani singer Nussrat Fateh Ali Kahn, she has synthesized a series of deep, evocative pieces that collectively make a profound statement about where creative jazz is headed — or *ought* to be headed, anyway.

Fred Hersch & Julian Lage: [Free Flying \(Palmetto\)](#): Recorded live at New York's Kitano Hotel, this duo outing by pianist Fred Hersch and guitarist Julian Lage — like the classic Bill Evans-Jim Hall albums of the 1960s — is a study in intuitive interplay and insightful interaction. Five of Hersch's compositions pay tribute to inspirational artists, and Sam Rivers' "Beatrice" and Thelonious Monk's "Monk's Mood" serve as vehicles for inspired exploration.

Phil Woods & the Festival Orchestra: [New Celebration \(Chiaroscuro\)](#): At age of (nearly) 82, alto saxophonist Phil Woods remains a powerful force in the world of jazz. This new big band session showcases Woods' distinctive sound and authoritative swing, plus eight of his compositions, ten of his arrangements, and a strong array of top flight soloists.

Various Artists: [Salsa de la Bahia Volume 1 \(Patois\)](#): OK, did you know that San Francisco had a lively salsa and Latin jazz scene? Well it does, and this two-disc set, compiled by trombonist Wayne Wallace, documents it with state-of-the-art tracks by percussionists Benny Velarde and John Santos, flutist John Calloway, the all-star Estrellas de la Bahia band, and many more. If you love Latin music these are not merely great CDs. They are essential CDs.


