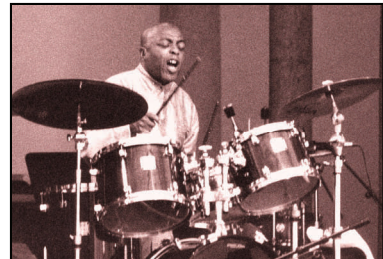

NEW & RECOMMENDED CDS

Roy Haynes: Roy-alty (Dreyfus): At the age of 86 Roy Haynes is still an unwavering master of time and an astounding dynamo of rhythm. On this varied new release the versatile drummer heads his aptly (and ironically) named Fountain of Youth band — he keeps *them* young — and is joined by two eminent guest artists, pianist Chick Corea and trumpeter Roy Hargrove.

Ted Rosenthal: Out of This World (Playscape): Pianist Ted Rosenthal and his colleagues (bassist Noriko Ueda and drummer Quincy Davis) dive headfirst into that seemingly inexhaustible font of creativity, The Great American Songbook. Their inventive treatments of standards by Arlen, Porter, Rodgers, Gershwin, Strayhorn, and more are bold, fresh, filled with surprises, and anything but "standard."

Poncho Sanchez & Terence Blanchard: Chano y Dizzy! (Concord Picante): Trumpeter Terence Blanchard joins percussionist Poncho Sanchez and his band in a loving homage to two of the founders of Afro-Cuban jazz. Their stimulating tribute to these musical pioneers includes classic compositions by Gillespie and Pozo, plus tunes by Ernesto Lecuona and Ivan Lins, and originals by some of the group's members.

Gerald Wilson: Legacy (Mack Avenue): For composer-arranger Gerald Wilson, a new big band CD, spotlighting a new major work, is now an annual event. This year the 93-year old wonder gives us the seven-movement *Yes Chicago Is... (Suite)*, along with his "variations" on themes by Stravinsky, Debussy, and Puccini, plus original pieces by his son, guitarist Anthony Wilson, and grandson, Eric Otis.

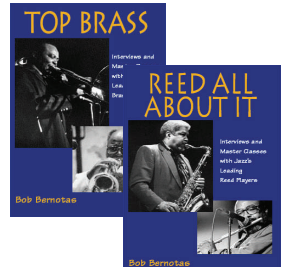
