Hi Friends —

His immense body of work exuded both folksiness (“gosh-all-git-up, how’d they get so lit up?”) and erudition (“each star its own aurora borealis”). He collaborated with some of the elite of America’s popular composers — Arlen, Kern, Carmichael, Warren, Van Heusen, Mancini. He set lyrics to movie themes, jazz instrumentals, and French *chansons*. He also had an ear for melody and created some fine ones of his own. And he was the *original* “singer-songwriter,” but unlike most of today’s so-called “singer-songwriters,” he actually could sing and he wrote songs that became genuine standards. He’s the man I call “America’s Poet”: **Johnny Mercer**.

On **Sunday, November 18**, the anniversary of Mercer’s birth (as if I needed another reason to play his songs on the air) I’ll be celebrating Savannah’s favorite son on both my radio shows. That morning at **11:00** on **The Sinatra Hour** I’ll be offering a full program of Mercer’s work as sung by — *you have to ask?* (*The Sinatra Hour* is heard only on local radio, but Internet fans, have no fear. I will record the show and add it to the [radio page](#) of my website.) Then that night during **Just Jazz** I am dedicating my weekly “**Just Jazz Presents...**” feature hour to the songs of Johnny Mercer performed by the greatest voices of jazz.

So, my huckleberry friends, please join me come rain or come shine on that special day of wine and roses — and brilliant song — and help me pay tribute to (I’ll say it again) **America’s Poet**.

NEW & RECOMMENDED CDS

Andrea Brachfeld: [Lady of the Island](#) ([Zoho](#)): This largely Latin-flavored release by flutist Andrea Brachfeld is a thorough delight. Her solos are inventive and fluid, her compositions are appealing, her takes on Hancock, Hubbard, and Ellington are fresh, and stellar guests like trumpeter Wallace Roney, trombonist Wycliffe Gordon, and percussionist Chembo Corniel add seasoning and texture to the mix.

Anat Cohen: [Claroescuro](#) ([Anzic](#)): *Claroescuro* is the Spanish term for the contrast of light and shade in the visual arts, an apt title for this multi-hued release by the gifted clarinetist-saxophonist Anat Cohen. On this fine CD Cohen displays her affinity for Brazilian music, her clarinet duets with Paquito D’Rivera (Artie Shaw’s “Nightmare,” Pixinguinha’s “Um a Zero”) are thrilling, and Wycliffe Gordon’s trombone and voice lend additional color to two tracks.

Steve Davis: [Gettin’ It Done](#) ([Posi-tone](#)): One of today’s most accomplished trombonists, Steve Davis delivers the message of hard bop at the head of a solid sextet that also features veteran pianist Larry Willis and long-time colleague alto saxophonist Mike DiRubbo. The venerable, no-nonsense genre is well-represented by six of Davis’ compositions, and he even cuts a deep, straight-ahead groove through that sixties favorite, “Sunny.”

Jay T. Vonada: [Groovin’ It](#) ([independent release](#)): Jay T. Vonada is a Central Pennsylvania-based trombonist who now has released his third CD, his second in this unique “trombone-organ trio” format. Joined by organist Alex Sell and drummer Kevin Lowe, Vonada proves without a doubt that his instrument fits just as comfortably, just as naturally, with the Hammond B-3 as the more often heard guitar or tenor saxophone.

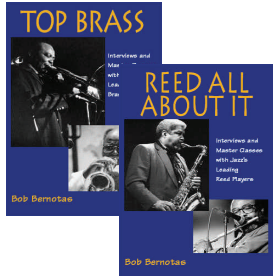
